There is no Kura on the above date. Kura will resume for normal operation on Tuesday 27th October 2020.

2. HEALTH & SAFETY AT ALERT LEVEL 1

Although we have moved to Alert Level 1, we must remain vigilant in our hygiene practices at Kura.

While everyone is onsite, we **must** continue to follow these health and safety measures;

- 1. There are no restrictions on personal movement at Alert Level 1, it is safe for all tamariki and kaimahi should be at Kura**
Only tamariki and/or kaimahi who are required to self-isolate (from advice by health authorities) or those who are unwell will need to stay away from Kura.
- 2. Good hand hygiene and cough and sneeze etiquette**
Regular washing and drying or sanitising of hands will continue as well as reminding tamariki to cough and sneeze into their elbow and resist touching their face.
- 3. Morning drop off & afternoon pick up**
Morning Drop Off - the top gate near Kura Teina will be the point of entry for all tamariki each day.
Afternoon Pick Up - tamariki will be released from the top gate near Kura Teina at the end of each day.
Arriving Late and Leaving Early - If your tamariki arrive late (after 9am) or leave early (before 3pm) they will need to sign in or sign out and enter/leave through the main Tari entrance.

4. Lunch orders and drinking fountains

Lunch orders are available and all drinking fountains are ready for use. If tamariki are ordering their lunch, please direct them to the Tari upon arrival with their order form and money.

5. QR Code Posters and encouraging whānau to download the NZ COVID Tracer App and use it if they come onsite

Official QR Code posters are displayed in all main entrances to the Kura.

Whānau are encouraged to download the NZ COVID tracer app and use it when you come onsite to Kura

Our vistab system will be in place, to support contact tracing for whānau/visitors who do not use the app.

Please remind your tamaiti/tamariki about the 5 health measures above so that they remain well informed. The more confident our tamariki are, the easier it will be for them.

3. DOCUMENTATION FOR TRANSPORT ALLOWANCE

Like last year, all transport allowance payments will be deposited into your nominated bank account. Whānau are required to supply the Tari with a copy of the following documents;

2. Most recent proof of address

We kindly ask that all of these documents are handed into the Tari by Week 6 (20.11.2020) of this term to allow admin staff time to initiate this process.

5. SWIMMING PROGRAMME CONSENT FORM
