

Hākinakina 2025 - Information for all whānau

General information for all our whānau for our 2025 sports calendar. We currently have two Netball teams this season with another possibly two teams for Kura Teina.

We have four Basketball teams, juniors, seniors mixed, boys and girls teams, we also have 1 x 3 on 3 team as well.

All participating ākonga and whānau will sign a Code of Conduct which will be available for you when you have your first team hui / training.

Waka Ama

Waka Ama will begin **this Sunday 6th April** Lake Pupuke. As this is a whānau lead kaupapa, Whanau participation throughout training is imperative. Our instructors are not responsible for any tam

training is imperative. Our instructors are not responsible for any tamariki while waiting on shore for a turn. This is the responsibility of each individual whanau. We also require support in moving the waka from the sheds down to the water as well as fitting each tamaiti with a life jacket.

Attire: Please ensure your tamaiti wears clothes appropriate for the weather and comfy shoes as well as a hat. Bring along a towel just incase and a water bottle.

Fees: \$60 per tamaiti for the season. The season will go from this April-April 2026. Fees are payable to the kura. We may have a break during the wetter months and then come back before another break over the Christmas and New year's holidays.

Commitment to seeing through the season is essential in terms of making a real go of it. Please see below the Team Reach code for our group named Waka Ama. This will be used to notify start times, any changes and for notification of absences from training. Timely notification is essential so that we have enough instructors and waka prepared for the training session.

SWISH 3v3 Poitukohu Comp - Tau 5 - 13

Each term SWISH run a competition for the following ages on the following nights -

Yr. 5 & 6 (Mixed), Monday afternoons between 4pm and 6pm Yr. 7 & 8 (Mixed), Wednesday evenings between 6pm and 9pm Yr. 9 to 11 (Mixed), Tuesday evenings between 6pm and 8pm Yr. 11 to 13 & Open Men's, Monday evenings between 6pm and 8pm

The Yr. 11 to 13, Open Men's opens the door way for matua or / and kaiako to form a team or two as well

Each team is only 5 players, so dependant on interested parties, we could form multiple teams

There is plenty of room in the Yr. 9 and upwards competitions, pretty full in the younger grades, however, once numbers are known, SWISH is wanting to awhi and support as much as possible

Including our current coaches to ensure, we are not overloading our teams, who still play the 5x5 competitions this year
